Pavilion Booking Information

If you have visited Detroit Abloom, you know our 38'-wide pavilion, which abuts the pond, is a serene and uplifting space. We rent out the space to like-minded individuals and groups to help support our nonprofit. Some examples-

We do not allow any flesh (meat, fish, or eggs) on the property because we are creating a Garden of Eden-type consciousness and advocate having compassion for all life. Dairy and alcohol are alright.



Pricing – We work with each booking to determine a fair price. Workshops, yoga, and group meetings are priced starting at \$50/hour. If you are offering a free workshop, there is no charge.

What is also included with the pavilion -

- · Eight electrical outlets around the base of the pavilion.
- · The water source at a nearby sink, is non-potable.
- Outdoor bathroom with a compostable women's toilet, a men's porta potty and a wheelchair accessible porta-potty.
- Two 16'-long wooden Community Tables and 6' & 4'-long tables available upon request.
- · Approximately 30 plastic chairs, mostly white and nonmatching.
- · Interior lights and two exterior floodlights.
- · Hand Washing station
- · Our outdoor kitchen area and the fire pit may be used upon request.
- · Plenty of street parking on either Manistique or Ashland. If you have a number of items to unload, you can enter the alleyway behind the pavilion from Scripps.



Other information – Because of cool breezes from the trees, the pavilion is typically around 10 degrees cooler than the outside temperature. There may or may not be mosquitoes depending on the weather. Since our garden is always open to the public, you may see other visitors exploring the gardens. We are located in the middle of a residential neighborhood that is normally very quiet. We do not currently have a wi-fi connection at the farm.
